Prof. Dr. Georg Kreis has studied in Basel, Paris and Cambridge, History, German and Geography. He concluded in 1972 a PhD at the University of Basel with a thesis on censorship in Switzerland during the Second World War and in 1981 a Postdoctoral thesis at the University of Basel with a study of the status and behaviour of the III French Republic up to 1914.

He was Director of the Europainstitute from 1993 – end of July 2011 and is professor emeritus for Modern History at the History Seminar at the University of Basel since 2009.

He is still teaching History at the Europainstitute. He has been Chief editor of the journal *Schweizerische Zeitschrift für Geschichte* (Swiss Journal on History) (1992-2004), Director of the National Research Programme No. 21 “Cultural Variety and National Identity” (1985-1993), Board member of the National Research Programme No. 42 “Principles and Possibilities of Swiss Foreign Politics”, Member of the Independent Expert Commission “Switzerland – Second World War” (1996-2001), Member of the Independent Commission examining the past of the Alfred Toepfer-Stiftung, Hamburg (1997-2000), Member of the Steering Committee of the European Science Foundation Committee regarding the Programme “Occupation in Europe. The Impact of the National Socialist and Fascist Rule” (2000-2004), President of the Steering Committee of the National Research programm 42+ “Switzerland-South Africa” (2001-2004) since 1980, Member of the editorial staff of the French-Swiss journal *Relations Internationales*, President of the official Swiss Commission against Racism (1995-2011).
