In 1994, her first documentary, Fragments from the Lower East Side, was awarded in Switzerland and in the US. Back to Switzerland, Werenfels realized Pastry, Pain & Politics (1998), a short film which was awarded with the Swiss Cinema Price. The director also collaborated with swiss german television, realizing the TV show Meier Marylin (2003), starring Bettina Stucky, who won the Swiss Cinema Award for best leading actress. In 2006 she signed Nachbeben, her first fantasy long film.
