Sibylle Berg (1962) was born in Weimar, lived with a foster family in Constanta and later also in Israel, Germany and has Swiss citizenship. She writes novels, essays, short fiction, plays, radio plays, and columns.

Berg is a contemporary author who is considered one of the most famous and influential writers and playwrights in the German-speaking world. Their 15 books have been translated into 30 languages. Sibylle Berg has won numerous prestigious awards over their many years of career. Berg's writing was compared to that of Kurt Vonnegut, Brett Easton Ellis, Michel Houellebecq, and Will Self. She has become an iconic figure in German alternative sub-cultures, gaining a very large fan base among the LGBT community and the European artistic communities. Sibylle Berg was awarded the Swiss Book Prize for her latest novel 'GRM – Brainfuck'. In 2020 she received the Grand Prix Literature for her work, the highest award given by Switzerland for literary work.
