Anne-Christine Fornage is Full Professor at the Faculty of Law of the University of Lausanne. She wrote her doctoral thesis under the direction of Professor Pascal Pichonnaz on 'The enforcement of consumer contract rights' which received the 2012 Vigener Prize of the University of Fribourg. She completed her LL.M. at the London School of Economics and Political Science and is admitted to practice Law. At the University of Lausanne, Anne-Christine Fornage teaches Contract Law, Consumer Law, Digital Markets Law and European Private Law. She has been lecturing in various countries and was a visiting professor at the Sorbonne University Abu Dhabi, the City University of Hong Kong and McGill University. Her publications focus on structural imbalances in contracts concluded with professionals, particularly in the context of the digitized economy. She is also an expert of Product Safety Law (including aspects of Civil Lability), Unfair Competition Law and Securities Law. Anne-Christine Fornage has been appointed President of the Federal Commission for Consumer Affairs since 01.01.2024. During her four year term, she will provide advice on Consumer Law and Policy to the Swiss Government.
